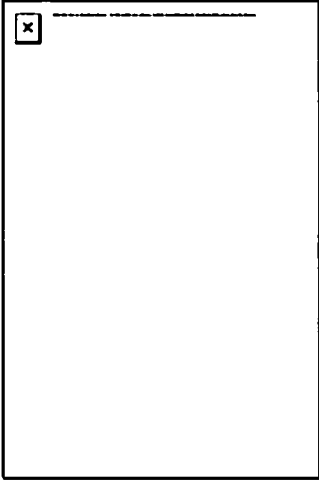
Please keep the 32 sq rule .
