FOREST TRAIL NOW OPEN

Hamilton, MT. – The Darby Ranger District on the Bitterroot National Forest has announced that the Rock Creek Trail #580 which closed several weeks ago due to the Moe Fire, is reopen to the public. The trail which is located west of Lake Como and leads into the Selway-Bitterroot Wilderness has been closed since October 2nd.

The Forest also announced that Sawtooth Creek Trail #123, closed during the Sawtooth Fire, will remain closed due to falling snags and rolling rocks and debris that continue falling on the trail from nearby burned areas.
