Dear Grant Applicant,

The application period for matching funds through the federally funded Volunteer Fire Assistance (VFA) program (US Forest Service) is now open. Completed applications must be received by **May 15, 2014**. The application may be found on the website: www.dnrc.mt.gov/Forestry/Fire/Grants. **Funding is conditional upon available allocations to this program.**

Single applications representing county-wide fire organizations receive priority. Attach one Appendix A (page 4 & 5 of application) for each individual department and list the project for that department. At the top of each Appendix A, please write the name of the organization that corresponds to the appendix. For county-wide projects (a project that benefits all departments within a county; i.e. repeater system), include one Appendix A and note that it covers all the departments listed in the main body of the application.

As in the past, projects with wildland fire emphasis will receive priority. Communications equipment should be capable of integrating with state and federal firefighting forces (P-25, analog and narrow-band). Construction or improvement of fire stations for housing equipment, normal operational expenses and maintenance do not qualify for VFA funding. Incomplete applications or those missing elements may not be considered, so please look them over carefully and do not rely on last year's application. Please review the 2014 Purchasing Guideline for allowed/not allowed purchases; wildland projects will receive priority for those funds. Also, please be aware that as of January 1, 2010 federal fire agencies required the new generation fire shelters on fires on federal land, particularly if any reimbursement or pay is anticipated.

The VFA grant has been an excellent source for local fire organizations and we encourage your participation. These grants have benefited all 56 counties within Montana. We appreciate the work involved in coordinating the departments within a county and combining the applications so that the grant funding is balanced and fair. Although most people are not aware of the effort it takes to complete this process, the benefits of how you have put these funds to practical use is obvious to those in the fire community.
