There is no argument high traffic and noise disturbance has become regular on this once quiet street. (Not to mention the new guy who flies his private plane over Victor almost daily low enough to cause the dogs and chickens to stir) The crosswalk sign and painted lines have done nothing to deter those starting at 0530 in the morning to sometimes 0230 in the morning. I am not elderly but I do have a small child and am disabled. Like me, many have sacrificed to live here for the solitude. My neighborhood is filled with disabled veterans and elderly with scattered families whom live here for the peace, quiet and safety. Last weekend my elderly neighbors across the street moved up the mountain because they did not want to witness a child or deer get hit, which isn't a matter of if but when. We don't all have that luxury. Last night a herd of 12 deer were crossing Main into my yard, a never ending magical moment, when a car came racing down only to lean on his horn until the deer scattered. This is becoming a norm and the neighborhood is suffering. Not a single person I speak with is happy about the sudden change of environment. Another family with young kids moved in two doors down this summer and also quickly moved out, disappointed their children cannot even ride bikes up and down the block. We thought colder weather would help but it has not. Is there anything more we can do?
