Dear Commissioners Chilcott, Huls and Burrows,

My family moved to Stevensville a year ago as refugees from Connecticut.

We chose Ravalli County for its freedom and were happy to see businesses that allowed customers to choose whether or not to mask up. I made a note of businesses that chose to insist on masks. I will not shop at those businesses even now because they gave away their freedom voluntarily.

The issue of masks and vaccine mandates are politically motivated. The inability of the CDC to identify the virus or to establish a test that can identify the virus, together with their recent statement that masks do not stop the virus show that there is no reliable scientific evidence to support lockdowns, masks or vaccine mandates. On the contrary, the evidence shows that there is a 99% chance of surviving the virus, while 12,000 vaccine related deaths have been reported to VAERS. That is an average of 1000 deaths per month since vaccinations began. This does not include the long-term heart and neurological damage done to people who have been vaccinated. It is estimated that only 1% of vaccine related injuries are even reported to VAERS. I am happy to supply links to this information upon request.

I am writing to request that you once again respect the individual liberties of Ravalli County voters by not mandating any health measures or lockdowns in the name of COVID-19 or any of its variants. The truth is becoming known. It will be even more difficult to enforce any measures to strip citizens of their liberties. We need to open up our businesses, unmask our citizens and get on with our lives.
