Good afternoon,

Construction on the South of Stevensville Safety Improvements project continues throughout the month of October. Crews will continue to relocate utilities, install fencing, and conduct pipe work on the Eastside Highway, Highway 269.

Next week, drivers should expect similar traffic control measures from the past few weeks. There will be minimal delays as pilot cars lead cars through a single lane of traffic in a two-mile work zone. The two-mile work zone will shift throughout the week as crews conduct pipe work between North Birch Creek Road and Pine Hollow Road. This will only be taking place during the day, and no traffic control will be set up at night. Drivers should continue to practice caution on this stretch of roadway 24 hours a day.

Weekly updates will be provided every Friday throughout construction.
