Good afternoon,

With spring just around the corner, MDT and Schellinger Construction are resuming work on the Stevensville Safety Improvements project. Starting Wednesday, February 23, crews will be working between North Birch Creek and Bell Crossing. Pilot cars will be utilized once again to safety guide traffic in the area. Drivers are encouraged to be mindful of changing conditions, reduce their speed, and be alert for workers.

Crews will be on-site Monday through Friday from approximately 7:30 a.m. to 6:30 p.m. If daylight allows, however, crews will be starting earlier. To kick off the 2022 construction season, crews will be updating/replacing irrigation lines and stabilizing banks on the south end of the project.

Entire construction operations will be in full swing by March. Motorists traveling through the area can expect delays and reduced speeds within the construction zone. Traffic control will also be working with local schools to ensure busses have priority throughout the project to get all to school on time.

Thank you, once again, for your patience and grace throughout this project. We know it's been a long time coming and we look forward to delivering a safer, smoother road for your summer recreation travels!
