Notice for PUBLIC COMMENT**

**Darby Lumber Lands Watershed Improvement and Travel
Management Project Environmental Assessment**

USDA - FOREST SERVICE Bitterroot National Forest, Darby
Ranger District, Ravalli County, Montana
The Environmental Assessment (EA) for the Darby Lumber
Lands Watershed Improvement and Travel Management Project
has been completed and is available for public review and com-
ment. The purpose of the project is to reduce road-related sedi-
ment entering streams on National Forest System Lands in the
Rye and Sleeping Child Creek drainages and to bring area
streams into compliance with Bitterroot Forest Plan and Montana
Department of Environmental Quality standards, including the
2011 Bitterroot River TMDL. About 66 miles of road are pro-
posed for decommissioning, and about 51 miles proposed for
storage. The project also proposes to designate several existing
roads as part of a sustainable route system for OHVs < 50',
along with building several connector trails to form loop routes.
The project will also promote the long-term existence of several
aspen stands for wildlife habitat. The project area encompasses
approximately 28,758 acres in the South Fork Sleeping Child and
Rye Creek drainages, in the Sapphire mountain range, east of
Darby, Montana.

The project proposes construction of 0.4 miles of new road that
would be open to full sized vehicles to connect two forest roads
and bypass private land, construction of 3.4 miles of trail for
OHVs < 50' in width, and designation of 2.9 miles of historic sin-
gle track trail already on the ground for motorcycle use. Best
Management Practices needed to protect water quality would be
installed on these routes prior to them being opened for motor-
ized use.

The project area is located in the South Fork of Sleeping Child
and Rye Creek watersheds and includes portions or all of T3N,
R18W; Sections 2 through 11, 16 through 21, 29 and 30; T3N,
R19 W; Sections 1 through 25, 28 through 32; T4N; R19W; Sec-
tions 30 through 38; T4N, R20W; Sections 25, 35 and 36.

notice and supporting documentation is also available for review
at the Darby Ranger District in Darby, Montana; and at the Su-

The proposed project is an activity implementing a land manage-
ment plan and not authorized under the HFRA and is subject to
36 CFR 218 Subparts A and B.

How to Comment and Timeframe
This notice corrects the mailing address included in the original
legal notice published Saturday, January 24, 2015. Specific writ-
ten comments (\$218.2) on the proposed project will be accepted for
30 calendar days following publication of this notice in the
Ravalli Republic, the newspaper of record. The publication date
in the newspaper of record is the exclusive means for calculating
the comment period. The regulations prohibit extending the
length of the comment period.

Only individuals or entities (as defined by 36 CFR 218.2) who
submit timely and specific written comments (as defined by 36
CFR 218.2) about this proposed project or activity during this or
another public comment period established by the responsible
official will be eligible to file an objection. Other eligibility re-
quirements are defined by 36 CFR 218.25 (a)(3) and include name,
postal address, title of the project and signature or other verifi-
cation of identity upon request and the identity of the individual or
entity who authored the comments. Individual members of an
entity must submit their own individual comments in order to
have eligibility to object as an individual. A timely submission
will be determined as outlined in 36 CFR 218.25 (a)(4). It is the
responsibility of the sender to ensure timely receipt of any com-
ments submitted. Names and contact information submitted with
comments will become part of the public record and may be re-
leased under the Freedom of Information Act.

Comments should be within the scope of the proposed action,
have a direct relationship to the proposed action, and must in-
clude supporting reasons for the Responsible Official to consider
(36 CFR 218.2).
