Subject: Urban Highway Program Priority - Marcus Street from US 93 to Silverberry Street

Dear Mr. Smith:

Thank you for your letter dated September 15, 2015 from the City of Hamilton and Ravalli County Commission revising the scope of the Marcus Street project as Hamilton's Urban Funding priority. As outlined in your letter, it is now the intention of the City of Hamilton and Ravalli County to nominate improvements on Marcus Street from US 93 to Silverberry Street. MDT Statewide and Urban Planning and Missoula District personnel have determined that the estimated cost for all phases of the revised project, including indirect costs and inflation, is approximately \$1.5 million; however, it is anticipated that costs will be further refined as project development progresses.

Based on the city's annual allocation of \$176,297 coupled with the current balance for federal fiscal year 2016 of \$528,891, it will take approximately 6 additional years to accrue the amount needed for a complete funding package for this project. Project development and construction can take between 4-7 years for a project of this scope. MDT will begin the process of securing Transportation Commission approval and programming now but please note that the year of construction for this project is dependent on funding availability estimated today to be in 2022.
