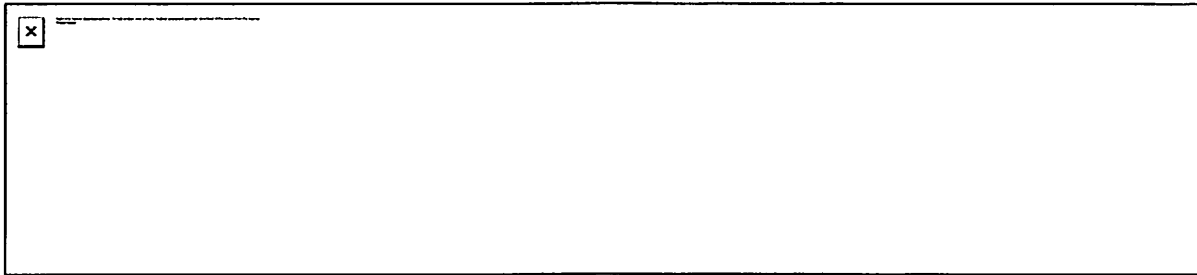

Education Reception to Focus on Invasive Species at State Capitol April 3

An educational event to spread awareness about the risks and impacts invasive species pose to Montana's waters and lands will be held Monday, April 3, from 11 a.m. to 3 p.m. at the Montana State Capitol rotunda in Helena.

During the event, hosted by the Montana Invasive Species Council, visitors can learn about invasive species issues, see life-size invasive species in costume - like the emerald ash borer - and play Whac-a-Mussel, an arcade game where you can beat back invasive species like zebra mussels from infesting new water bodies. "Clean - Drain - Dry" prevention measures also will be featured.

Mussel Alert and Boater Program Talks Set for North Central Montana

The Joint Mussel Response Team will host open houses in April at eight towns in north central Montana to discuss the upcoming watercraft inspection season, new regulations, and local boater program certification.

The events will focus on Montana's plan to detect, contain, and prevent the spread of invasive mussels and other aquatic invasive species.

The open houses will run from 6-8 p.m., with a presentation beginning at 6:15 p.m. Local boaters can be certified after the presentation. Preregistration is not required.
