Hamilton, Montana (May 26, 2017) – Bitter Root Back Country Horsemen (BRBCH) and the Bitterroot National Forest are partnering on a trail improvement project on the Stevensville Ranger District. The project is scheduled for next Saturday, June 3rd at Larry Creek in the Bass Creek Recreation Area.

Volunteers will do general trail maintenance including clearing blow down and cleaning water bars and ditches on numerous trails. A sawyer will also clear any downed trees and limbs from the trails. The public should be on alert and watch out for volunteer work crews and stock on these trails.
