We do issue permits for events in parks, but I don't think we've ever had someone put up a display and leave it there. We recently received a request for a temporary veteran memorial, but before we could discuss the logistics, the organization found a different location. The Missoula County Courthouse has a large lawn area, and they may have some sort of policy in place for its use.
