Dear Interested Person,

This notice serves to fulfill requirements of Montana ARM rule 12.2.439(5) regarding completion of final drafts of EIS documents. You are receiving this notice because of your participation in completion of the final draft of the Southwest Montana Grizzly Bear Management Plan EIS. The final draft has been completed and can be found at the following website <http://fwp.mt.gov/fishAndWildlife/management/grizzlyBear>. In addition to the final document you will find a frequently asked questions section and FWP responses to public comments to the first draft. Director Hagener is expected to sign a decision notice the first week of February calling for grizzly bear management as described in Alternative II. This alternative calls for status quo management of grizzly bears in SW Montana that strives to maintain the bear population in a manner that will allow for delisting of the population while minimizing negative impacts to the human population in the area.

Broad public notification of FWP's final decision is expected in early February. A brief summary of this decision and details within the EIS will be presented to the Fish and Wildlife Commission at the February 13th meeting in Helena.

Dear Interested Person:

Montana Fish, Wildlife & Parks is requesting public comment on the Keep Cool Hills Management Area Biennial Rule. This proposal would extend for two years, through F&W Commission rule, a 15,000-acre cooperative management area north of Lincoln that was established by commission rule in 2007. Sieben Ranch Company owns most of the land, with some parcels owned by the Montana Chapter of The Nature Conservancy. A portion is State Land, administered by the Montana Department of Natural Resources and Conservation. The cooperative management area rules would provide for managed public access throughout the year. Prior to 2006, unmanaged public access resulted in significant resource damage to lands in this area, causing affected landowners to consider closing the area to public access. Keep Cool Hills Cooperative Hunting Access and Recreation Management Area

Public Use Special Regulations

BIENNIAL RULE

Montana Department of Fish, Wildlife and Parks and the Montana Fish & Wildlife Commission adopts the following rules and regulations to govern recreational use within the designated Keep Cool Hills Hunting Access and Recreation Management Area in Lewis and Clark County for the purpose of gaining hunting access and recreational privileges on private land, to prevent vehicular damage to soils and vegetation, and to avoid excessive disturbance to native wildlife including threatened and endangered species.

This Rule is effective from 3/29/14 to 3/28/16 .

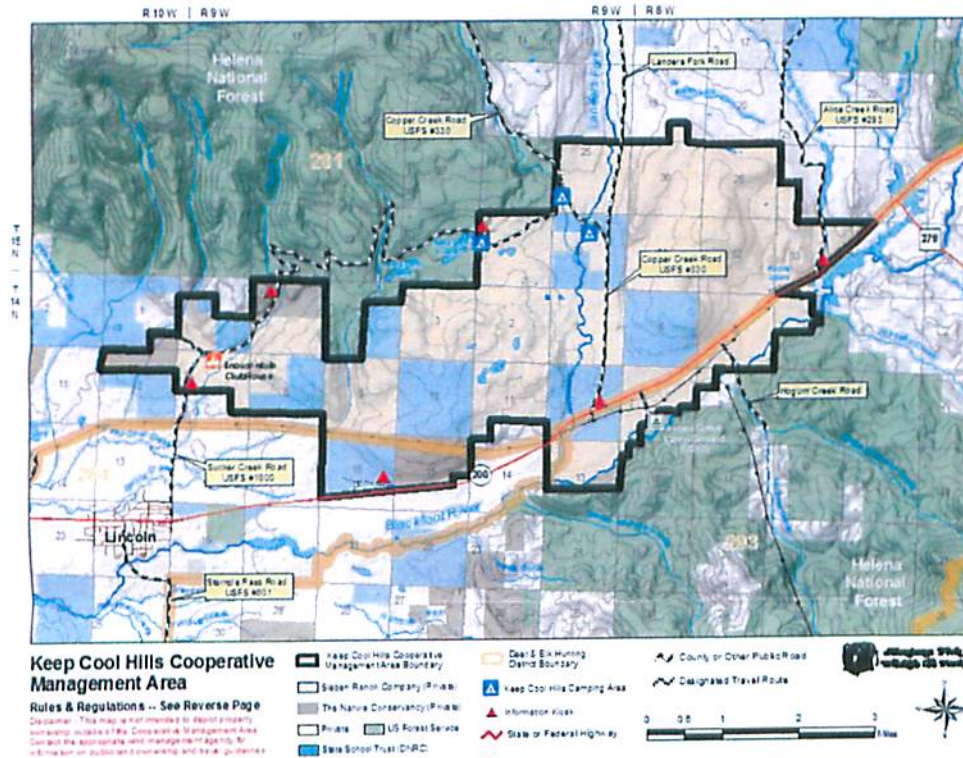


Figure 1. Keep Cool Hills Cooperative Hunting Access and Recreation Management Area Map.

The designated area of the Keep Cool Hills Cooperative Hunting Access and Recreation Management Area is depicted in Figure 1 below:

Because the public enjoyment of the recreational facilities of these lands necessitates rules, regulations and enforcement, the provisions of 23-1-106 and 87-1-303 M.C.A. apply. It is therefore ordered that it shall be unlawful for any person to:

- 1. Drive any motorized wheeled-vehicle in the above-described area except on county roads, on private roads designated open for motorized travel, or in designated parking

and camping areas as posted. Landowners and/or their designee in the course of administrative work, and federal, state, and county officials in the course of their official duties will be exempt from these vehicular restrictions.

2. Park any vehicle in such a manner as to obstruct traffic or block any gate.
3. Trespass, hunt, or discharge a firearm within areas posted as safety zones. Target shooting and discharge of firearms is prohibited on Sieben Ranch Company land from June 1 through August 31, annually.
4. Remain in the above-described area when ordered to leave for cause by a landowner or law enforcement officer.
5. Camp on Sieben Ranch Company or The Nature Conservancy land except in designed areas as posted. Camping on DNRC land is allowed within 200 feet of customary access points, but limited to 7 days.
6. Disturb, harass or otherwise interfere with livestock.
7. Operate a snowmobile in the above-described area between April 2 and November 30. Snowmobile use is allowed seasonally from December 1 through April 1, and shall be restricted to designated trails.
8. Conduct commercial outfitting or guiding of hunters or fisherman in the above-described area.

STATEMENT OF LEGAL AUTHORITY FOR THE RULE

Section 23-1-106, MCA and section 87-1-303, MCA gives the Fish & Wildlife Commission authority to adopt and enforce rules governing uses of lands that it operates under agreement with or in conjunction with a private owner.
